But most importantly, I want to invite you to attend the Night Out and meet your friends and neighbors and be part of community in action celebrating our first responders at the fieldhouse from 6-9pm.

The 12th annual Brad Joseph Memorial Golf Outing was held on Saturday, July 13th at Colonial Golfers Club. Thanks to golfers Dennis Bowsher, Tim Theodore and Larry & Shirley Moser for representing St. Paul's church. Also, thanks to Norm Grigsby, Jamie Wyant, Sue Theodore, Dan Best and Tim Piper for volunteering to help with the outing. It was a great day for golf! There were 15 groups of golfers. Elida St. Paul's was a \$100 hole sponsor and also donated \$83 from our coins-for-communion collection this month to the memorial fund. The proceeds from the outing were \$4,210. The BJ Memorial fund now has \$47,600 in it and is used to send 3-4 people each year on medical mission trips to other countries. Also, \$1,050 will be donated to the St. Paul's camping fund to send children to camps and adults to retreats. To-Go Baked Oatmeal

Ingredients		Instructions
2 large	Eggs	Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Makes 16 muffins.
1/4 cup	Canola oil	Makes 10 murrins.
1 cup	Brown sugar (packed)	Line a muffin tin with paper or foil muffin liners. (Do not skip the liners!)
1/2 cup	Applesauce	In a large bowl, whisk the eggs, oil, and brown sugar until sugar is dissolved. Add the applesauce, milk,
1 1/2 cups	Milk, skim	vanilla, salt, and cinnamon. Whisk until well combined. Stir in the oats and baking powder.
2 tsp.	Vanilla extract	Fill the muffin tin with 1/4 cup of the oat mixture in
1/2 tsp.	Salt	each muffin cup. Add your favorite toppings and push the toppings down into the oat mixture with a spoon.
1 Tbl.	Cinnamon, ground	Bake for 30 minutes. Let them cool for 5 minutes before eating. Store in an airtight container or freeze in
3 cups	Oats (old fashioned rolled)	a zip top freezer bag.
2 tsp.	Baking powder	Optional: Choose your favorite toppings such as chocolate chips, blueberries, dried cranberries, nuts, etc.

Living Our Faith

A Day Away In A Quiet Place

Maya Angelou said, "Each person deserves a day away in which no problems are confronted, no solutions searched for. Each of us needs to withdraw from the cares which will not withdraw from us." Similarly, when Jesus' disciples were consumed with ministry, he urged them, "Come with me by yourselves to a quiet place and get some rest" (Mark 6:31, NIV).

The late days of summer might be just the time to seek "a day away" not only from problems but even from ministry. While serving God and others can be energizing, we must balance work with rest. God set that example, resting after creating the world; Jesus set that example, calling his disciples away — not just alone, but *with him* — to be refreshed.

Spend a relaxing day at a lake. Go on a scrapbooking retreat or a leisurely hike with a friend. Find a monastery that welcomes guests, and experience 48 hours of prayer and silence there. Invite Jesus into that time and space. And remember another message he shared: "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest" (Matthew 11:28, NIV).
