

Dear Friends,

Why ReFocus? You have heard me talking about ReFocus for the last year and a half. There were Focused Living Retreats offered to everyone to begin a personal transformation process to prepare you to participate in refocusing the ministries of the church. Participation in the retreats was small. Yet, most of those who participated felt they were worthwhile and beneficial to their personal walk with God as well as their preparation for the next phase of ReFocus.

The urgency to refocus the ministries of St. Paul's is clear. We have experienced a steady decrease in the average number of worshipers on Sunday mornings over the past several years. As I prepared the 2009 year end report, the average number of people in worship dropped from 105 to 99. That doesn't mean that people quit coming to church. But those of you who do attend worship are attending less often. You are traveling, visiting, working, studying, and supporting youth in outside of church activities and even confirmation activities.

What it does mean is that we have not been bringing new people to church and have not intentionally gone out to meet people who are in need of a church family. In the mean time, just 50% of persons surveyed by the Barna Group self identified as Christian. 23% of people are unattached to a church, and 15% are what the Barna Group identifies as "intermittents"—those who have been to church in the last year, but have not been to church in the last month. The urgency for St. Paul's is clear.

And the urgency is clear for the community and the world. While over 70% of people say they believe in God, many of those do not believe they need to be connected to a church to have faith. They are right...all they need to do is believe (John 3:16). But, to have the fullness of life that Jesus promised, to be in relationship with God and live in the already of Eternal Life, one must have a relationship with the church which is the living body of Christ in the here and now.

How we as a congregation decide to be intentional in our outreach ministry as we enter into intentional missions with our community will be determined through our ReFocus process. I urge you to participate in this process, beginning with prayer (see related article on page 5, "A Month of Prayer for the Church").

I'll see you in church.

A MONTH OF PRAYER FOR THE CHURCH

We are well on our way into 2010, and have begun to make progress in beginning Phase II of ReFocus. The ReFocus Team (RFT) has been chosen, and they will be approved at a meeting of Administrative Council in February and we will commission them to the work of ReFocusing the church's ministry. They will then attend a training session in March or April with other RFTs from the Network of which I am a part. At that time, they will learn the details of what will happen at the Summits.

In the mean time, we will be in prayer as a congregation. In a recent leadership training, one of the presenters talked about beginning a similar process for his congregation with a month of prayer. I realized as he spoke that there was no intentional prayer focus organized for St. Paul's as I began to introduce ReFocus. So, in a meeting with Lavonne, who has agreed to be the Prayer Coordinator for ReFocus, we decided that we would encourage prayer for St. Paul's UMC in the ReFocus process in the month of February.


We have developed a daily sign-up poster which we have asked everyone to sign up as a visual for the congregation that we are, indeed, praying for St. Paul's church. We ask that your prayers be centered around the following:

- 1. Asking God's forgiveness for not coming to God sooner.
- 2. Seeking God's guidance for our ministry.
- 3. That God would reveal to us who/what our intentional ministry will be.
- 4. That God will be with the RFT and Administrative Council in discernment and decision making.
- 5. That God will guide the congregation in participating in the decisions and changes that will come as a result of prayer, the ReFocus process, and God's will for the church and our community.

By God's grace, and with God's help, St. Paul's UMC will become "a healthy, growing, spiritually vital, risk-taking center for making and equipping disciples of Jesus Christ for the purpose of transforming the world." (from the mission statement of The West Ohio Conference of the UMC)



News from the Board of Trustees

Projects that the Trustees are looking at for 2010

The trustees had their January meeting for this year. We had a long discussion on what we wanted to get done for this year. As usual there are a lot of projects to do around the buildings.

The end of last year we had Barry Electronics give us a quote to install an audio-visual system in the sanctuary. The system included two screens in the front and one screen on the back wall. We would have to buy some special software and a computer to run the system. They gave us three different options to look at. The cost was from \$10,000.00 to \$12,000.00 for the different systems. We have a person that has offered her help to run a small financial campaign. We have \$4500.00 in Memorial Fund money that could be used and some money has been given to the project already. This would be a great addition to our worship service.

We were given some insurance money to replace the damaged cabinets in the kitchen. This is a project that needs to happen. We want to set the base cabinets 4" off the floor, so the next time we have water in the basement it will not damage the cabinets.

The sanctuary walls need painted, as you can see the wall studs through the paint.

There is some work to do on two rooms to finish the remolding.


This is the outside work that needs to be addressed this summer:



- 1. Our parking lot needs to at least have the cracks filled this summer.
- 2. This December we picked up a couple of bricks that came out of the big chimney. There is a section that has bulged out and we have lost a lot of the mortar. This is a big concern for us. It could be a large expense.
- 3. The bell tower needs a lot of tuck pointing and the bricks need to be sealed.
- 4. The front of the church needs painted this year for sure.
- 5. The front trees need to be trimmed.

As you can see, the Trustees have a lot of work to do. We will see how much money the finance board can give us this year and prioritize the jobs in the order that we can do them. Just like at home, some of the work will carry over to next year. We, as trustees, welcome any suggestions and a <u>lot of help</u> from you all.

UPCOMING EMMAUS WALKS IN SIDNEY AND FINDLAY

The next upcoming women's Emmaus walks will be the Greater Findlay Area Women's Emmaus Walk on February 11th through 14th in Findlay and the Greater Sidney Area Women's Emmaus Walk on February 25th – 28th in Sidney. The next upcoming men's Emmaus walks will be the Greater Findlay Area Men's Emmaus Walk on March 11th through 14th in Findlay and the Greater Sidney Area Men's Emmaus Walk on March 18th – 21th in Sidney.

The Walk to Emmaus is a 72-hour experience of Christian spiritual renewal and formation. You enjoy three busy days singing, learning, laughing, praying, worshipping and participating in small groups. Discussions center around fifteen talks given by laity and clergy. The theme of each talk is God's grace, how that grace comes alive in the Christian community, and how it expresses itself in the world. You'll also discover how grace is real in your life, how you live a life of grace, and bring grace to others. You will have the opportunity to participate in the daily celebration of Holy Communion and to understand more fully the body of Christ. You will experience God's grace through the prayers and acts of anonymous service offered by the Emmaus community. You will leave with an experience of Christian love in action that will equip you for new levels of grace-filled service and leadership.

For more information about the Walk to Emmaus, please contact any of our 18 church members that have attended an Emmaus Walk. They will be glad to discuss the Emmaus experience and to sponsor any individual wishing to attend a walk.

MISSIONS COMMITTEE UPDATE

The St. Paul's Missions Committee has designated the month of February as our congregation's formal period of financial contribution to the Haiti disaster relief effort. Special envelopes will be located in the pew racks for your use with this mission offering. The Committee designated \$500 be sent immediately to the UMCOR (United Methodist Council on Relief) team that is assisting with this Haiti situation.

During December, 2009, meetings, the Committee and the Administrative Council designated \$50 be sent to the Northwest Plains District office for use with a children's summer camp in Mexico. We received a District-wide solicitation for this particular effort.

The Committee designated the 2010 'Coins for Communion' offerings as follows: Jan. – Hope Center, Lima; Feb. – July – United Methodist Children's Home; Aug. – Heartbeat of Lima; Sept. – Five Loaves Food Pantry, Allentown U.M.C.; Oct. – Samaritan House, Lima; Nov. – Our Daily Bread, Lima; Dec. – Salvation Army, Lima.

During December, 2009, the Committee heard an Acts 434 missions presentation. Persons from Allentown U.M.C. and The Future Church in Lima are trying to create a non-profit agency to assist the Lima Allen County residents in areas of meals/food pantry; education assistance; utilities assistance; and construction. The St. Paul's Missions Committee will add this opportunity for ministry into the general discussion of missions concentration during the upcoming 'Re-Focus' program.

Our 2009 Christmas offerings totaled \$1,899. This amount will be divided between St. Paul's benevolent fund administrated by Pastor Ruth and the ministry outreach of the Elida-Gomer-Allentown Ministerial group. Also, the annual hat/glove/scarf Christmas tree received significant donations, too. Martha Vazquez and Marty White delivered large bundles of winter wear to Our Daily Bread soup kitchen on Central Ave. in Lima and to the Samaritan House adjacent to St. Rose Catholic Church, Lima. These were wonderful displays of mission outreach by the members of St. Paul's – thank you!


Did Scooby know I was having a problem? Do you believe in that possibility or was it wishful thinking?




