




Easter Offering

History of a Hymn

Christ the Lord Is Risen Today

1739

And if Christ is not risen, then our preaching is empty and your faith is also empty.

1 Corinthians 15:14

John and Charles Wesley soon found themselves out of favor with many fellow Anglican ministers who spurned their fiery evangelistic preaching. Many pulpits were closed to them.


A friend from his Oxford days, George Whitefield, 22, who was having the same trouble, began preaching in the open air. In London, he asked Charles to stand with him as he preached to thousands in the open air at Blackheath, and Charles, too, got a vision of reaching the multitudes.

He made his first attempt in the outskirts of London. "Franklyn, a farmer, invited me to preach in his field," he wrote. "I did so to about 500. I returned to the house rejoicing." Soon he was preaching to thousands. "My load has gone, all my doubts and scruples. God shone upon my path; and I knew this was his will concerning me."

A man named Joseph Williams heard Charles in Bristol: "I found him standing on a table-board, in a erect posture...surrounded by, I guess, more than a thousand people, some of them fasionable persons, but most of the lower rank of mankind. He prayed with uncommon fervency... He then preached about half an hour in such a manner as I have scarce ever heard any man preach... I think I never heard any man labor so earnestly to convince his hearers they were all by nature in a sinful, lost, undone, damnable state; that notwithstanding, there was a possibility of their salvation, through faith in Christ... All this he backed up with many texts of Scripture, which he explained and illustrated, and then by a variety of the most forcible motives, arguments, and expostulation, did he invite, allure, quicken, and labor, if it were possible, to compel all, and every of his hearers, to believe in Christ for salvation."

Charles Wesley still preaches today in much the same way through his ageless hymns which are sung around the world each Sunday. Perhaps his most exuberant anthem is the one he simply called, "Hymns for Easter Day," published in 1739. It originally consisted of eleven stanzas. The "Alleluia's" were added later, but approximately, for this is a hymn one never gets tired of singing:

Christ, the Lord, is risen today, Alleluia! Sons of men and angels say, Alleluia! Raise your joys and triumphs high, Alleluia! Sing, ye heavens, and earth, reply, Alleluia!





Our Church History



Featured Recipes from St. Paul's Great Cooks

Sweet and Salty Snack Mix By Shirley Shoup **Ingredients** Instructions 4 cups Corn chips, regular flavor Heat oven to 375 degrees. Spray large roasting pan with non-stick cooking spray. Crispy rice cereal, bite 4 cups sized squared Combine corn snacks, cereal, pretzels and pecans in Pretzels, small salted twists 1 cup prepared pan; set aside. 1 cup Pecan halves, or peanuts Combine brown sugar, butter, corn syrup, and salt in 2 quart heavy saucepan. Cook over medium heat, stirring cashews or walnuts occasionally, until mixture comes to a full boil. Remove 3/4 cup Brown sugar, firmly from heat; stir in vanilla and baking soda. Pour syrup packed mixture over cereal mixture in pan; toss to coat. 1/2 cup Butter Bake 15 minutes, stirring every 5 minutes, or until coating 3 Tbl. Corn syrup, light is set. Remove from oven; stir. 1/2 tsp. Salt Spread mixture onto waxed paper. Cool completely; stir in chocolate pieces. Break into pieces. Vanilla 1 tsp. Store in container with tight fitting lid for up to 1 week. 1/2 tsp. Baking soda 1 1/2 cups Candy coated chocolate (10 oz.)pieces, use holiday colored candy for festive flare



Living Our Faith

A Modern-Day Parable

In Luke 15, Jesus tells three parables about the precious being lost and, at great lengths, found again. The kingdom of heaven, he says, is like that. But most of us don't shepherd sheep and wouldn't fret over one lost coin. A child, on the other hand ...

In fall 2019, as night fell in northern Minnesota, 6-year-old Ethan and his dog wandered off. Family and police grew frantic because the area consisted of fields, woods and swamps. Authorities requested assistance.

The kingdom of heaven, Jesus might say, is like 600 volunteers searching diligently in the dark for a child they didn't know. It's like Steve Fines who, though also a stranger to the boy, grabbed his company's pricy heat-seeking drone and worked the camera for hours, until it detected Ethan huddling with his dog, safe but cold. Yes, the kingdom of heaven — indeed God — is like people giving their all and refusing to quit until the lost one is found.

All Things In Common

Just as the bread is made out of many grains ground and mixed together, and out of the bodies of many grains there comes the body of one bread, in which each grain loses its form and body and takes upon itself the common body of the bread; and just as the drops of wine, in losing their own form, become the body of one common wine and drink — so it is and should be with us. ...

Through the interchange of [Christ's] blessings and our misfortunes, we become one loaf, one bread, one body, one drink, and have all things in common.



—Martin Luther, Treatise on the Blessed Sacrament
