

August is here, and there is so much happening around the church. Kids are getting ready for school; the harvest is just around the corner; we are putting together kits for the Festival of Sharing; the Kindness Campaign is kicking off, and so much more. Also, a bit of savings for you. From July 30 to August 8, it is Ohio Tax-free days, and nearly everything you purchase will be tax-free, up to \$500 (no motorized vehicles, alcohol, tobacco, or marijuana). That means you can purchase everything for school, health, or menstruation kits tax-free until the 8th.

We are in need of expanding our education program this fall, splitting into two groups, Pre-school through Kindergarten and Elementary. We have the younger classroom covered, but we are looking for people to help share the Elementary class. The more volunteers we have, the easier the schedule will be on you all (yes, parents of children are eligible to help). Please contact me or the church office if you would like to help.

This election season we are "Campaigning for Kindness." When division feels all too common during election season, we can choose a better way. Choosing kindness isn't about avoiding our differences but navigating them with respect and compassion. Jesus said, "Do unto others as you would have them do unto you". You are invited to be a part of the Kindness Campaign 2024. We will have a sermon series, bible studies, a Sunday school curriculum, and much more to come as we go through this campaign season, and I hope you will join me in "Campaigning for Kindness."

August 6th will officially kick off the "Kindness Campaign" at the National Night Out at the Field House in Elida. We have everything we need for the event, and I want to encourage you to come out and spread the word to our community. Even if you are not signed up to work at the bouncy house, please wear your "Do Unto Others" shirt (if you bought one), stop by our table, and pick up some stickers to hand out. I want you to hand out stickers to people you know, explain to them what the Kindness Campaign is (don't panic, it's on the flyer, with the sticker attached), and ask them to put the sticker up where others will see it. We also have yard signs available for \$9 each, which can placed in your yard alongside your political signs. The more we get out there the better. Maybe you would like to sponsor some signs to be handed out in our community free of charge? Contact me, and we can talk about what that would look like. Also, think about buying a sign for a business you frequent and asking them to put the sign up in their place of business.

Like I said, there is a lot going on this Fall. Keep looking for where God is at work, and join God there. Until then, I will see you in the mission field.

History of a Hymn

God Be With You

"Then Sings My Soul", By Robert J. Morgan

1880

Grace, mercy, and peace be with you from God the father and from the Lord Jesus Christ, the Son of the Father, I truth and love. 2 John 3

On September 19, 1945, missionary Darlene Deibler was liberated from the Japanese Prison Camp at Kampili, seventeen days after Japan had signed the Instrument of Surrender aboard the USS *Missouri*. She was in bad shape, having been subjected to years of physical suffering and mental torture.

Eight years before, Darlene and her husband, Russell, had landed as missionaries in New Guinea. Plunging into the work, they were making solid progress in building a growing church, aided by Darlene's dear friend and mentor, Dr. Robert Jaffray. Now both Russell and Dr. Jaffray were dead, and Darlene was leaving behind two lonely white crosses on the hillside. As a 28-year-old widow, she was returning home without a single possession. All her mementos and private keepsakes were gone, her loved ones were dead, and her body was debilitated by exhaustion, starvation, malaria, beriberi, and dysentery.

For over four years, she had witnessed atrocities that can scarcely be described. Prisoners all around her suffered horrible deaths, and she herself had seen the inside of death cells. During that time, not one letter or package had reached her.

As the boat carried her from her island prison, she prayed a bitter prayer: "Lord, I'll never come to these islands again. They've robbed me of everything that was dear to me."

Suddenly she heard voices, Indonesian voices ringing from the distance. There on the shore were those who had come to know the Lord through her mission, raising their voices, singing: "God Be With You till we meet again. / By His counsels guide, uphold you, / With His Sheep securely fold you; / God be with you till we meet again."

Darlene later wrote in her autobiography, *Evidence Not Seen:* "This song released the waters of bitterness that had flooded my soul, and the hurt began to drain from me as my tears flowed in a steady stream. The healing had begun. I knew then that some day, God only knew when, I would come back to these people and my island home."

"God Be With You Till We Meet Again," was written by Jeremiah Rankin, pastor of Washington's First Congressional Church and president of Howard University, the great African-American college in the nation's capital. He wrote it, he said, after discovering the term "good-bye" meant "God be with you."



Peach Crumb Bars

Ingredients		Instructions
3 cups	All purpose flour	Preheat oven to 375 degrees
1 1/2 cups	Sugar, divided	Whisk flour, 1 cup of sugar, baking powder, salt and cinnamon; cut in shortening until crumbly.
1 tsp.	Baking powder	In separate bowl, whisk eggs and vanilla until blended; add flour mixture, stirring with fork until crumbly.
1/2 tsp.	Salt	Reserve 2 1/2 cups crumb mixture for topping. Press remaining mixture onto bottom of greased 13x9
dash	Ground Cinnamon	baking pan.
1 cup	Shortening	Toss peaches with almond extract. In separate bowl, mix cornstarch and remaining sugar;
1 large	Egg	add peaches and toss to coat. Spread over crust; sprinkle with reserved topping.
1 tsp.	Vanilla extract	Bake 40 to 45 minutes or until lightly browned and
9 medium	Peaches, pealed and chopped	filling is bubbly.
1 tsp.	Almond extract	Cool completely, cut into bars.
4 tsp.	Cornstarch	



You don't have to visit the beach to make a sandcastle. Make fluffy "moon sand" to build fun structures.


What you need:

- Large bowl
- Wooden spoon
- 8 cups flour
- 1 cup baby oil



What you do:

- Measure flour into the large bowl. Add baby oil.
- Mix thoroughly until all the oil is combined and the texture is consistent. If needed, use your hands to knead the mixture.
- The sand is ready when it sticks together to form a ball when pressed in your hands.
- 4. Use sand toys and molds to create a sandcastle. Store sand in an airtight container for up to two weeks.



God's Gift Of Music

What helps you sort out what you're feeling, or experience an emotion more deeply? What allows you to let loose and cry, or fully celebrate when you're joyful? Nature helps some of us get in touch with our feelings, perhaps because it removes us from screens and other distractions.

But when getting out isn't possible — no mountain lake is nearby, or the weather isn't tranquil — consider the gift of music. Often instrumental or vocal music helps us access the depths of our soul like nothing else can. God may even speak to us through music — whether in song lyrics, our own inner thoughts or wordless stirrings of the heart.

Albert Schweitzer, a pastor, musicologist, physician and more, said, "Joy, sorrow, tears, lamentation, laughter — to all these music gives voice, but in such a way that we are transported from the world of unrest to a world of peace, and see reality in a new way, as if we were sitting by a mountain lake and contemplating hills and woods and clouds in the tranquil and fathomless water."

Make some playlists for various emotions: joy, grief, anxiety, hope. Then imagine yourself relaxing in nature, and experience God's love.
