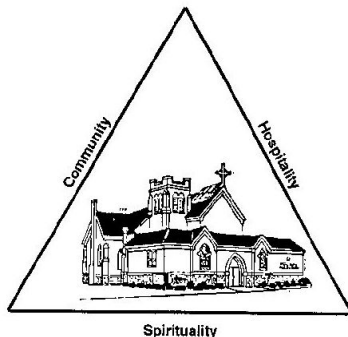

Before I get started with January's newsletter, I want to take a personal moment to thank all of you who have sent us cards, gifts, and food this Christmas and during our time of loss with Ted's passing, funeral, and graveside service. You have shown us the love of Christ in all your actions cards and hugs. The Scannell's have made it through a long and trying 2022. Your love and support have been essential to our not just surviving, but our growing closer to Christ through your caring and love. Thank You! Thank You! Thank You!

2023, a new year, and nearly a quarter of the way through the 21st Century, the older I get the faster time flies by. My babies are growing up fast, and this year our 3rd child will be moving out, and we are getting closer to being empty nesters. 2022 brought a lot of changes to everyone, and we at St Paul's, were not immune from the effects of time. We lost more than our share of people, some passed away, and some moved away, but we also gained a group of new faces as God continues to be faithful to all of us. I am blessed to count myself a part of this church's footprint on the Elida Community, and I look forward to how God can use us to be about the work planned for Elida and the world.

I wanted to speak to you briefly about our structure of leadership here at St Paul's; if you looked at the list of people in positions, here at church, you will notice the committees have gotten smaller. We chose to do this so we do not have people on multiple committees (there are still a few), which will free us up to create some groups for short-term projects on temporary committees. Making it easier for you to say yes to the work of the church, knowing it may only last 6-12 weeks, then disband once the task is accomplished. If the experiment does not work, we can revisit the arrangement at any time to create leadership in our church that allows us to complete the work and still be active in ministry to all of God's children.

Finally, January is of course the month I focus on Women of Faith in my sermon series. The first Sunday of January will be about Epiphany, and the next 4 will be the Women of Faith series. For the last two years, I have focused on women of faith who are not Biblical characters, 2023 will focus on Biblical women who have not only been faithful but are indeed heroic. We will look at Hannah, the mother of Samuel (a genius whose faith is overwhelming), Deborah, the judge (whose strength and leadership saved her people), Esther, a young woman who overcame her fear (Queen of an empire who saved her people), and Priscilla, a leader and mentor to leaders of the early church (whose level head helped shape the church as we know it).

I look forward to what 2023 has in store for us, and until I see you at church in 2023, I will see you in the mission field.

White Chili

Ingredients		Instructions
1 (48oz.)	Northern Beans (don't drain)	<p>Add all ingredients and cook until thick. For creamy chili, add 1 cup sour cream.</p> 
1 to 2 cups	Chicken, white Cooked and cut up	
1 small	Onion, chopped	
1 can (small)	Chicken broth	
1 can	Green Chilies, chopped	
1 1/2 tsp.	Garlic powder	
1 tsp.	Salt	
1/2 tsp.	Pepper	
1 tsp.	Cumin	
1/4 tsp.	Cayenne Pepper	
1 tsp.	Oregano

TASTY CREATIONS

Make this yummy treat to remember what happened on each day of Creation.

What you need:

- 6 large pretzel rods
- Candy melts (white, chocolate and blue)
- Green sprinkles
- White or star-shaped sprinkles
- Fish crackers
- Animal crackers
- Adult help



What you do:

1. With help, melt the three colors of candy melts in separate dishes. Microwave for 30 seconds at a time, stirring until soft.
2. Decorate one pretzel for each day of Creation:
 - Dip half in white and half in chocolate to show light and darkness.
 - Dip half in white and half in blue to show separation of the atmosphere.
 - Dip half in chocolate, add green sprinkles and dip half in blue to show land, plants and water.
 - Dip in chocolate and add white or star sprinkles to show the stars.
 - Dip in blue and add fish crackers to show sea life.
 - Dip in chocolate and add animal crackers to show land animals.
3. Share the Creation story — and the snack — with a friend!

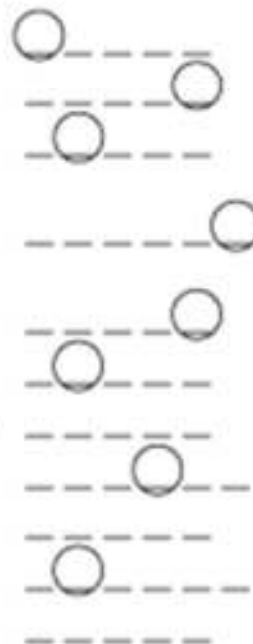

Living Our Faith

Baptism is serious business!

Baptizing people into God's family has always been a ministry highlight for Pastor Stan Purdum. One Sunday, he had the privilege of welcoming three infants and two young boys to the baptismal font, along with all their parents. After baptizing the babies, Purdum turned toward the families with older children, who'd been instructed to have their boys step forward one at a time.

Immediately, the 3-year-old shouted, "Not me!" and bolted for the exit. His father caught the youngster and carried him back as the congregation chuckled. This time, Purdum wasted no time completing the sacrament.

"Maybe this young boy was not greatly wrong to try to duck baptism," he later pondered. "Far from being a harmless little ceremony, baptism begins a lifetime commitment to God, which over the long haul is no easy thing. It lays upon us the responsibility to live up to the vows we have made." How seriously do you take your baptismal vows?
