

#### Prayer as a Place for Play

Writer Elizabeth Jarrett Andrew tells of attending a retreat focused on a type of meditation called centering prayer. She found it challenging to "set down [her] frantic internal voices" and "lean back into stillness." But one day, during a stretch of sleep, she had a dream: "My dear camel, who feels a sweet attachment to me, is ready to retire. I release him into a green-enclosed pasture. He cavorts; he frolics; he races in circles. He's gleeful and free. Poor beast of burden! I've been asking far too much of him."

Andrew's dream was a revelation: "Turns out silent prayer is a fence within which both [my camel] and I can lay down our baggage," she writes. "We can pause our trudge across the desert long enough to play."

Have you ever thought of prayer — especially silent prayer — as a fenced-in space where it's safe to lay down your burdens, pause your trudge through life, play, cavort and frolic? In God's secure love, we can relax, rejuvenate and experience freedom, even glee. Sometimes this, too, is prayer.

We sing three out of four Sundays every month and provide special music for additional services, such as Christmas Eve, Ash Wednesday, and Maundy Thursday, among others.



# **Hymn History**

#### There Is a Balm in Gilead

"Then Sings My Soul" Book 1, By Robert J. Morgan

#### **About 1800**

Who Himself bore our sins in His own body on the tree, that we, having died to sins, might live for righteousness—by whose stripes you were healed. 1 Peter 2:24

The first Africans on American shores arrived in chains. Their hellish voyage aboard slave ships was only the beginning of their sorrows. The breakup of their families, the oppression of bondage, the whips and shackles, their loss of dignity ... it all combined to kill both body and spirit.

But the souls of the slaves found release through singing, and a unique form of music evolved called the "Negro Spiritual." Spirituals differed greatly from the hymns we've this far studied. The classics of English hymnody were largely written by pastors like Isaac Watts and John Newton out of their studies of Scriptures. African-American slaves, on the other hand, composed their songs in the fields and barns, the words dealing with daily pain and future hope.

Often the slaves were allowed to sing while working. If, for example, they were hauling a fallen tree, they would combine muscles and voices, using the musical rhythms for a "Heave-ho" effect. Other times risking the lash or branding iron, they'd slip into torch-lit groves to worship the Lord. With swaying bodies, they would stand, eyes half-closed, singing, "Go Down, Moses," "Roll, Jordan, Roll, He's Got the Whole Word in His Hands," and the classic "There is a Balm in Gilead" based on Jeremiah 8:22.

"Hymns more genuine than these have never been sung since the psalmist of Israel relieved their burdened hearts," wrote Editha A Talbot.

Fisk University, in Nashville, Tennessee, was established after the Civil war, and the famous Fisk Jubilee Singers popularized these Negro spirituals around the world. Composers began arranging spirituals in a way that appealed to the large population and this gave rise to another type of Christian music, tagged by composer Thomas A. Dorsey as "gospel Songs."

Few Negro spirituals can be precisely dated, nor are many specific authors known, but they have mightily influenced American Christian music. The roots of the children's Sunday school chorus, "Do Lord," for example, is in this old spiritual:

O do, Lord, remember me!
For death is a simple thing,
And he go from door to door
And he knock down some, and he cripple some,
And he leave some here to pray.
O do Lord, remember me!







- · Black permanent marker


#### What you do:

- Clean the rocks and egg carton. Place newspaper on a table to protect it from paint.
- Paint all sides of the rocks and carton. Let dry. Add a second coat, if desired.
- When rocks are dry, number each rock (1-12) with marker. Place rocks in the carton.
- Play hide-and-seek with a friend. Take turns hiding the rocks in a room, sandbox or backyard. Give clues, if needed, and count the rocks as they're returned.

# **Living Our Faith**

#### Who, Me? Yes, You!

The Bible is filled with people who don't feel up to the challenge of serving God, speaking for God or leading his people. But God always knows what he's doing. Pastor Haviland Houston issues this challenge: "When you are hesitant to act, or feel a failure of nerve coming on, when courage lags, or even if laziness and the 'I don't care' blues get you down, may the words of Mordecai to Esther burn in your hearts and minds: 'And who knows whether you have not come to the kingdom for such a time as this?'" (See Esther 4:14.)

Max Lucado offers a similar reminder in *You Were Made for This Moment*. "God always has his person," he writes, also citing the book of Esther. "When we feel as though everything is falling apart, God is working in our midst, causing everything to fall into place. He is the King of quiet providence, and he invites you and me to partner with him in his work."

Lucado continues: "[God] has a Joseph for every famine and a David for every Goliath. When his people need rescuing, God calls a Rahab into service. When a baby Moses needs a mama, God prompts an Egyptian princess to have compassion. He always has his person. He had someone in the story of Esther. And in your story he has you."
